



Performance Setup

Performance Notes

- Marimba 1 uses hard mallet
- Marimba 2 uses soft mallet
- Performers move to the side of the marimbas in m. 100 - 144
- The following notations have been used for specific techniques

- + dead stroke
- ◆ hit between the node (dead spot) and the sweet spot
- ◇ hit on the node

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Program Notes

In this marimba duo, the players are asked to move in mirror image. They move in unison on two marimbas facing each other, as if they were a man and his shadow. However, like Peter Pan and his shadow, the two entities sometimes get separated, and wonder around in different directions at delayed time. The sonic result of this physical relationship between the instrument and the performers is a variation and canon in symmetrical harmony.
